

Foundation for Veterinary Dentistry Veterinary Dental Research Grant

The Foundation for Veterinary Dentistry (FVD) announces it is seeking applicants for research grants that will be awarded at the Annual Veterinary Dental Forum September 25, 2024, in Palm Springs, California. Research proposals on any topic relevant to veterinary dentistry, oral surgery and oral medicine are welcome, using the following format and schedule:

June 15, 2024: (to be received no later than 11:59 PM PST): Application deadline. June 20, 2024: Applications will be distributed to the FVD Grants Committee. August 15, 2024: Recommendations from the Committee will be forwarded to the FVD Board.

September 2024: Recipient(s) will be notified in writing and honored at the awards ceremony at the 38th Annual Veterinary Dental Forum in Palm Springs, California.

VERTERINARY DENTAL RESEARCH GRANT DETAILS:

Grants will be in the amount of \$10,000 to \$15,000. Grants received over this amount will be returned. The number of grants to be awarded has not been determined at this time. Only one grant will be allowed per institution.

FORMAT AND SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION:

COVER PAGE: Project title, Principle and Co-Investigator's names and contact information and a signature line below the following statement: By signing below, the Principal Investigator agrees to use the grant money provided by the FVD to complete a project as described in the project proposal, and that additional facilities, equipment and personal are available for completion of this project.

The rest of the application is to be <u>blinded</u> by the applicant – no names, addresses, or other identifying information included. The proposal, after removal of the cover page, will be distributed to the research grant team.

BLINDED SECTION OF THE PROPOSAL:

<u>First section</u> (maximum one page, not including references): Project title, introduction, and summary of project.

<u>Second section</u> (maximum three pages, not including references): Detailed research plan, hypotheses, objectives, and methods. Expected duration of project. The project must be completed in time for presentation of a summary at the Veterinary Dental Forum in 2025 with subsequent publication of the results in 2027.

<u>Third section</u> (maximum two pages): Resources needed for the project. In addition to the grant, what other resources (facilities, equipment, staff, clinical cases) will be needed to successfully complete the project, and how will these resources be made available?

<u>Fourth section</u> (maximum one page): Budget. Describe how the grant funds will be spent. If funds are proposed to be used for personal costs, justification of the role of the individual and confirmation that this person's time cannot be funded from existing sources of funds are required. <u>Fifth section (maximum two pages)</u>: References.

Please make certain that your proposal is redacted from all material that might identify you or your organization. Failure to do so may result in non-acceptance of your proposal.

SUBMISSION:

Submit the proposal as <u>two</u> separate Word or Acrobat (.pdf) files, one with the Cover page only and the second containing everything except the cover page. Submit the proposal via e-mail prior to the deadline:

GRANTS ACCEPTANCE CONDITIONS:

The distribution of the grant payments shall be made following the Veterinary Dental Forum and is subject to review by the Foundation for Veterinary Dentistry (FVD) Grant and Scholarship committee.

Progress reports should include a timeline for project completion, a result summary, and conclusions to date. Any limitations to completion of the work should be outlined in the progress report.

Progress reports should be submitted to the FVD Grant Chair and Co-chairs within (and no later than) 12 months from receiving the funds.

The Foundation for Veterinary Dentistry working through the Grant Committee expects that a scholarly presentation at the Forum and a peer reviewed manuscript are ultimate goals of grant acceptance.

The FVD Grant committee will consider applications for continuations or new grants **only** if progress reports have been submitted on time and/or your FVD funded project has resulted in publication in the peer-reviewed literature.

OTHER INFORMATION:

FVD will not provide funds for "Overhead" or "Indirect Costs."

Submissions that are received after the deadline or do not follow instructions for preparation of a blinded proposal as described above will be returned to the Principal Investigator unconsidered. This grant announcement is also available on the Foundation web page www.veterinaryDentistry.org.
